Piedmont trailed 13-0 by halftime and allowed one more touchdown in the second half.

After a three-and-out, Alameda scored on a six-play drive with 17:28 left in the half. During the series, Piedmont's Lily Colbert recorded a sack on 1st-and-Goal at the 11 yard line. However, Alameda scored on a third-down pass.

On Piedmont's ensuing possession, Dorothy Nemeth had a

15-yard reception to nearly convert a first-down, but Piedmont punted after being a few yards short. Alameda scored on its next drive, including converting a 3rd-and-21 situation, followed by a 40-yard touchdown pass—making it 13-0 with 11:54 before halftime.

Piedmont's offense couldn't muster a first down conversion in the opening 24 minutes, but held Alameda without another score in the remaining minutes of the first half. Making their mark was Ella Yasar and Dahlia Osman recording pass defenses, while Fujimoto had a five-yard tackle for loss.

Alameda scored the game's final touchdown in its first possession of the second half, scoring after nearly six minutes on a 10 play drive. PHS had a chance to force a turnover on downs, but AHS converted a 4th-and-4 on a five-yard pass.
