JV Highlanders lose 27-14 to Middletown

Piedmont's JV football team suffered its first loss of the season on Friday, September 6 at Witter Field, falling 27-14 to the visiting Middletown Mustangs after committing four turnovers on the afternoon. PHS tied Salesian the previous week in its season-opener.

This week's captains were sophomore Henry Brennan, and freshmen Jimmy Lagios, Joaquin Fierro, and George Saunders. Brennan was called up to varsity last week against Salesian.

The Highlanders received the opening kickoff but threw an interception on the third play of the game. Middletown drove toward the goal line, and although the PHS' defense got three straight stops inside the five-yard line, the Mustangs punched the ball across on the fourth down.

Piedmont's offense came out looking to change the momentum. Starting at their own 45 yard

line, Lagios tossed a screen pass to receiver Diego Hurwitz on the first play, taking it 55yards to the end zone for a 7-7 tie.

After multiple trades of possession, Piedmont defensive back Owen Curran intercepted a Mustangs pass on a deep pass down the sideline. Unfortunately, the Highlanders couldn't capitalize and both sides went into halftime knotted up at 7-7.

Middletown opened with possession in the third quarter, but Piedmont's defense forced a punt. On the ensuing possession, Lagios and Hurwitz connected for another big play to get the Highlanders into the red zone. Hurwitz then scored on an endaround for his second touchdown of the game, putting PHS up 14-7.

However, the Highlanders' joy was short-lived after the Mustangs answered with a touchdown of their own on the next possession. But on the ensuing kickoff Piedmont relinquishing a crucial fumble to Middletown, giving them great field position. The Mustangs ran the ball through the Highlander defense to score a go-ahead touchdown, 21-14.

On the Highlanders' next possession, Middletown nabbed an interception to take it all the way to the end zone increasing the deficit to 27-14 with two minutes to go.

The Highlanders look to bounce back this Friday against Mt. Eden of Hayward.
