THE SEASON—1965

With the graduation of this year's senior class will pass the majority of the almost legendary varsity football squad of 1965. This team, many of whose members had played together throughout four seasons of high school football, earned for itself and the school an undefeated season and the championship of the Foothill Athletic League. They added a proud and memorable chapter to the already impressive tradition of Piedmont football and displayed a prowess in the sport and a willingness to win that any team would be happy to possess.

The distinction of being undefeated league champions brought with it a host of honors to the whole team, its individual players and its coaches. The Varsity was the first undefeated squad that has played on Witter Field since 1942 and was the first undefeated, united team that Coach Bob Mventer has had in his seventeen year career at Piedmont. Coach Bob also had the honor of being named Coach of the Year and was invited to be head coach of the high school all-star Shrine Game at Los Angeles.

Piedmont was voted by the Press Team of the Week of Northern California. Tackle Jim Peters was recognized by both San Francisco papers for his outstanding ability, while quarterback Don Perkins was named Prep of the Week for his performance against Las Lomas. The All-League selection gave positions on first team offense to Piedmont's Bruce Burrows at end, tackle Neal Trebolich, fullback Bob Carmichael, and Quarterback Don Perkins, with center linebacker Jim Peters and defensive back George Williamson making the first defensive squad. All-League Honorable Mention cited Eric Hansen, Nick Graham, Dan Jones, Mitch Garrison, and John Kohlmoos for their consistently hard-hitting brand of football throughout the season. Burrows and Peters also represented Piedmont on the All East Bay Prep Writers All Star Team at their respective positions at end and tackle.

However, as anyone who knew the team will agree, our Varsity was hardly characterized by awards or statistics alone. Coach Bob, although he referred to the team a number of ways throughout the

There were the harassed managers, captained by Fred "the Pirate" Anderegg, and hustling Tom Harnett, the unsung team statistician. There were the Thursday night meetings, the prayers at the Church, the rowdy peace-disturbing caravans before the game. The '65 Varsity revived the custom of dedicating the game ball, notably to Coach Bob, Mr. Jack Stock, and to Rand Huff for an appendix that really wasn't. Of course the team suffered its casualties: Treb's and Palmer's knees, Jones' hand, Carmichael's head. And,

as if the enthusiasm of the team as a whole were not enough, Coach Sears created the ultra-elite second division "Blue Darts", so named because of the blue target jerseys that distinguished them from their less aggressive teammates. Yet surely none of these memories will be more vivid than the glorious root beer scrimmage that took place in the showers after the game with San Ramon. What other team would put such an impressive end to the season?

It was a great year, made so by "a bunch of boys" and a couple of coaches who had the ability and the spirit that it takes to win in football. Any player of the game would be proud to say that he was a member of the Piedmont Varsity of 1965.

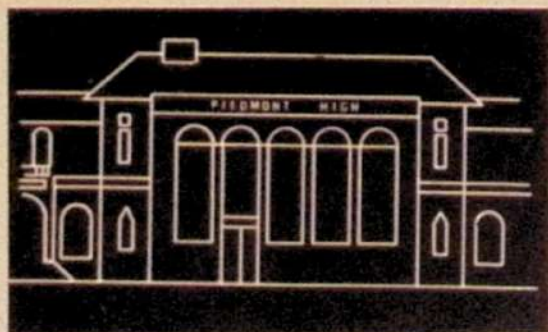

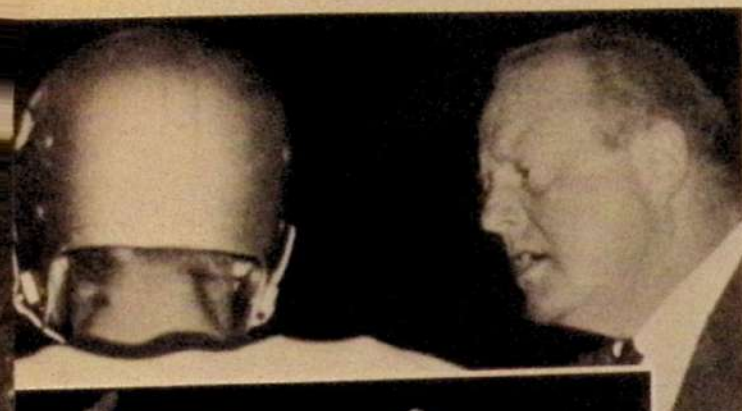

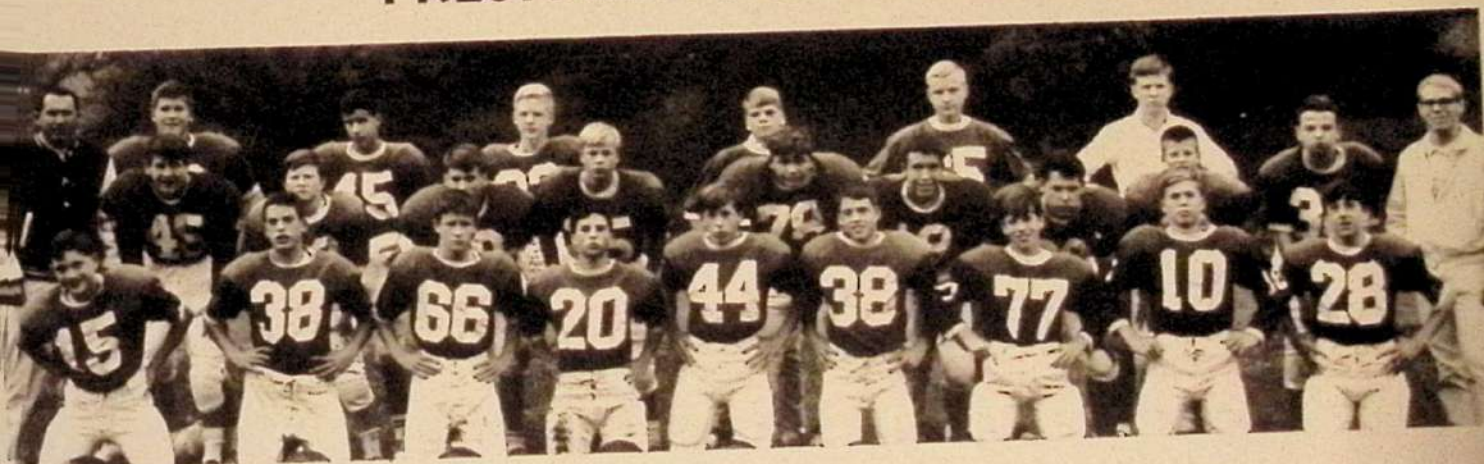
