

#### THE SEASON-1965



This team, many of whose members had played together throughout four seasons of high school football, earned for itself and the school an undefeated season and the championship of the Footbill Athletic Loopes. They added a proud and memorable chapter to the already impressive tradition at Predmont football and displayed a proviess in the sport and a willingness to win that any team would be happy to possess.

The distriction of being undefeated league champions brought with it a host of honors to the whole foom, its individual players and its coaches. The Varsity was the first undefeated squad that has played on Witter Field since 1942 and was the lirst undefeated, while at toom that Coach Bob Wenter has had in his seventies never over a Predmont. Coach Bob also had the honor of being named Coach of the Year and was invited to be head coach of the high school all-star Shrine Game at Los Angeles.

Piedment was voted by the Press Team of the Week of Northern California. Tackle Jim Pelets was recognized by both San Francisca papers for his autstanding ability, while quarterback Dan Perkins was named Prep of the Week for his performance against Los Lomas. The All-League telection gave positions on lirst seam offense to Piedmant's Bruce Burrows at end, tackle Neal Trebaitch, fullback Bab Carmichael, and Quarterback Dan Perkins, with center linebacker Jim Peters and defensive back George Williamson making the first defensive squad. All-League Hanarable Mention cited Eric Mansen, Nick Graham, Dan Janes, Mitch Garrison, and John Kahlmaos for their consistently hard-hitting brand of featball throughout the season. Burrows and Peters also represented Piedmant on the All East Bay Prep Writers All Stor Leam at their respective positions at end and tackle.

However, as anyone who knew the team will agree, our Varsity was hardly characterized by awards or statistics alone. Cooch Bob, although he referred to the team a number of ways throughout the




