

Varsity football finishes strongly

After losing five of their first six games, the Varsity football team picked up momentum toward the end of the season, winning their last four games to compile a respectable 5-5 record and finish second in the ACAL. Early in the season the team was plagued by mistakes and bad luck, especially against Miramonte and in a key game against Alameda. After losing their second league game to Encinal, it appeared to many that the Scots would have a very trying season, but the team never dropped their heads. The following week the Highlanders showed an impressive victory over Albany, shutting them out while putting 17 points on the score-

board. The Scots then returned home and proceeded to walk over Pacific 41 to 13. The next game, against San Leandro, was a little closer. The Scots came back to score the winning touchdown with less than two minutes to go in the fourth quarter, making the final score 14-13. The Highlanders wound up the season beating Harry Ells 34 to 12.

Offensively the team was led by quarterback Sandy Schwab, who threw for 1500 yards this season and was elected All-League. Randy Schwartz, All-League led the team in receiving, with Pete Dickinson and

Steve Ellis close seconds.

The defense was led by middle line-backers Rock Tonkel and Dave Willke who had outstanding seasons, and Jim Danielson, who received All-League honors at cornerback. Tremendous efforts both offensively and defensively were given by Gavin Kent, who played running back and free safety, and Craig Taylor, who played both defense and offensive line.
