An overview of the team's warm-up activities (above) are being captured in mid jumping-jack. Stretches were always a necessity before every game and practice to prevent injury.






Captain Eli Kersh- Oliva (right) carries the ball for a first down. Many considered Kersh the team's most valuable player because of his successful runs.


