



Tam, who has had a season long shoulder injury, was able to contribute a few carries before getting reinjured. 2. With a big kick, Andrew Strauch (11) sends the ball flying through the uprights to tack on the extra point. Due to a 150-acre bush fire in Livermore and high winds, the weather conditions on October 4th, the originally scheduled game day, were too poor to play in. The game had to be postponed to the following day, giving the team some extra time to discuss plays and prepare mentally. Before the game, the coaches pumped up the players by encouraging aggression, doing individual jobs, and playing for each other. Hunter Abel (11) soid, "I felt so great and accomplished because we completely leveled Richmond. I made six tackles on defense and really put pressure on their quarterback." 3. After the Saturday evening event, Cannor Garrett and Fiachra Collins (11) chest bump to celebrate their victory, beating the Oilers 49-0. During the game, Garrett, in running back, scored a touchdown while outrunning several people with good blacking. He later broke four tackles during a 25 yard run before scoring his fourth touchdown of the night. Collins contributed to the win by keeping Richmond's offense from scoring and making several fourth down stops. When asked how he felt when the game was first canceled, Collins said, was really frustrated because we were all ready for battle and last minute it all got canceled." After the game Collins said, "I felt like it was a successful win because they did not score even uprepared."




PRACTICING FOR SUCCESS

the upcoming game, got focused, and pumped each other up.










A SEASON TO REMEMBER Finishing the season with a 5-5 record, the team moved on to NCS in early November. Hunter Abel [11] and Joseph Mirante [12] bottle for the ball during the first round NCS game against Moreau Catholic an November 16th. In the beginning of the game, the team had a difficult time stopping their opponent's offense, but on the first pass Moreau threw, Atu Ohuafi [12] made an interception and ran it back for a touchdown. The team beat Moreau 54-50, advancing them to the next round of the CIF North Coast Section Playoffs. During the second away game of NCS on November 22nd, Gabriel Watson [10] mokes a break away against Fortuna. In the last play of this game, Joseph Mirante [12] got to run the ball for the first time all season after continuously asking the coach. Although the team lost the second game 21-48, they made Highlander history by advancing to the semifinals for the first time since 1997.
