

Piedmont's JV football team came away with a narrow 12-6 victory at Salesian Prep to open its season on Saturday, August 30 in Richmond. The team entered its season with 18 freshmen, eight sophomores, and three juniors who knew they had a lot of talent but hadn't yet seen how it translated in a real game.

Piedmont's offensive line gave quarterback Jonah Cha-Foster enough time to find his receivers as he finished the game with two passing touchdowns, one to Mason Gray, and another to Mateo Long, who made a diving catch in the end zone for the catch. Cha-Foster finished the day with 100 passing yards, as well as another 40 yards on the ground.

Piedmont went on a long drive on the ensuing possession but ultimately turned the ball over on downs at Salesian's 12-yard line.

When Salesian got the ball back, Piedmont forced a turnover on downs but failed to take advantage. With four minutes left in the game, Salesian regained possession.

With two minutes left and Salesian threatening to score, outside linebacker Cyrus Emanuelson read the quarterback's eyes to snatch an interception and secure Piedmont's Week 1 victory.

Additional key players in

this game included running back-linebacker Vaja Mafi who had some explosive rushing plays on offense as well as some bruising tackles on defense. Tight end Jed Gilbert also had a good game securing a couple of catches and making effective blocks to help open up run lanes.
